Getting Around The School

Accessibility Support

While we are hoping to change Huron's extremely limited accessibility, our historical buildings make it a goal we continue to strive towards. Until then, staff and community are there to help!

Currently, in order to assist with wheeled mobility aids, modular ramps can be moved to the *side door by the field*, and where mobility limits stair usage in general, spaces on the ground floor can be easily arranged for meetings. Zoom meetings or phone calls with educators can also always be requested. Huron also uses hybrid meetings (streaming online and in person simultaneously) so that everyone can take part in monthly School Council Meetings.

At Huron we understand that accessibility is more than just 'a ramp'. If there is an environmental suggestion, or other accommodation that aligns with you or your family's needs or if you have any suggestions or comments, please speak to your homeroom teacher or call the school principal, Mr. Rewega.

Before and After School Program Support

Supervision is provided between 8:45 a.m. and 3:45 p.m. each day. Students should be supervised by parents/caregivers outside of those hours.

Huron Superfriends

Huron Superfriends is a childcare centre located onsite - in Huron Street Public School -with before and after school support from 7:30am to 6pm, Monday to Friday. They also offer a lunch program, occasional support, and childcare on PA days, and holidays.

"Superfriends currently runs two programs, a Kindergarten and a School Age Program. It is licensed by the Ministry of Community and Social Services to provide care for 59 children from six to twelve years of age for the School Age Program, and 52 children from three and a half to five years of age for the Kindergarten Program. During the school year, only Huron Street Public School children are eligible for daycare enrollment. In the summer months enrollment is open."
